The Department of Restorative Dentistry and Biomaterials Sciences at the Harvard School of Dental Medicine is initiating a search for an established investigator to join the Faculty of Medicine on or before July 1, 2006. We are seeking an individual with interests and funded research activities in the study of stem cell differentiation, biomaterials and tissue engineering.

Qualifications for this position include a DDS/DMD/MD degree or equivalent, a PhD degree, postdoctoral experience and 3-5 years of funded research.

The Harvard School of Dental Medicine, currently in the implementation phase of a strategic plan for research, has recently restructured and realigned departments to enhance its mission in research, teaching and patient care. As part of the implementation of the strategic plan, a new Research and Education Building was completed in the fall of 2004. The building offers 25,000 square feet of new research space designed to foster innovative, interdisciplinary and interdepartmental research in mucosal and skeletal biology and pathology. These new initiatives, combined with the richness of research conducted in the wider community of Harvard Medical School and its affiliated hospitals as well as other institutions in Cambridge and Boston offer an ideal environment for outstanding accomplishments. Furthermore, the position promises great academic fulfillment in working with and mentoring of outstanding predoctoral students, advanced graduate students, postdoctoral fellows and junior faculty members.
