The Center focuses on teaching medical students to integrate population health and health systems perspectives in their clinical, research, and policy roles. The faculty member will receive 50% support to develop programs, curricula, and materials, and for teaching in this area. S/he will assist with a new, required 1st year Harvard Medical School course in Clinical Epidemiology and Population Health as well as with other initiatives to integrate these themes into pre-clinical and clinical experiences. Additional roles of this full-time faculty member will include clinical work, research, or public health practice.

The Department of Ambulatory Care and Prevention has a multi-disciplinary faculty of approximately 35, including researchers, educators, social scientists, epidemiologists, internists, pediatricians, and biostatisticians. Clinical faculty members practice at Harvard Vanguard Medical Associates or at teaching hospitals in the Boston area.

Ideal candidates will have an MD or DO and Masters in Public Health or equivalent degree; background in epidemiology, public health practice, or related activities; and a record of excellence in teaching and curriculum development.
