



## ANNOUNCEMENT SUMMER VETERINARY TRAINING PROGRAM

The Summer Program for Veterinary Students at the New England Primate Research Center has been in existence for over thirty years, and we feel that it has been extraordinarily successful. Funding is provided by the Comparative Medicine Program of the National Center for Research Resources of the National Institutes of Health, generally allowing four students to participate.

Participants spend the summer working in one of two research divisions at the Center (Comparative Pathology and Primate Medicine). During this time they participate in the ongoing research program of the laboratory and gain experience in diagnostic and experimental pathology. In addition, they have the opportunity to observe first-hand the duties and responsibilities of a clinical veterinarian in a large research facility employing nonhuman primates as laboratory animals. Inasmuch as the student's exposure is based on pathologic aspects of disease processes, we generally prefer to select students who have had general pathology, usually second through fourth-year students. This is not an absolute requirement, however. The successful candidate will be placed on the casual payroll at the Center and receive \$13.00 per hour, based on a 35-hour week, for a maximum of three months. A background check may be required.
